iMercy: The Divine Hotspot

Monday: "iMercy: The Father Blesses"

Fr. Bill's preaching focuses on the unconditional love of the Father. Being a Christian means knowing your heavenly Father loves you not because you are good but because He is good. The evening concludes with an invitation to anyone, especially families (intact, broken, troubled, struggling, separated by distance, etc) to receive a special blessing with the Oil of Saint Joseph from the Oratory of Saint Joseph in Montreal.

As for you, do not seek what you are to eat and what you are to drink, and do not worry anymore. All the nations of the world seek for these things, and your Father knows that you need them. Instead, seek his kingdom, and these other things will be given you besides. Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom.

Luke 12:29-32

Tuesday: "iMercy:The Son heals"

Fr Bill's preaching focuses on the remedy the Father provides for us in His Son Jesus who by His death on the cross sets us free from sin, enables us to forgive and gives meaning to our suffering. The evening concludes with an invitation for those in need of healing (physical, emotional, spiritual) to adore our Eucharistic Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved, He said to his mother, "Woman, behold your son." Then he said to his disciple, "Behold your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his home.

John 19: 25-27

Wednesday, "iMercy: the Spirit Strengthens"

Fr. Bill's preaching focuses on the power of the Holy Spirit which enables us to live the Christian life and propels us to be witnesses of Jesus Christ in the world. The evening concludes with a sending forth blessing utilizing a first class relic of Saint John Paul II taken from his blood-soaked sash on the day he was shot in St. Peter's Sauare.

For this reason, I remind you to stir into flame the gift of God that you have through the imposition of my hands. For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control. So do not be ashamed of your testimony to our Lord, nor of me, a prisoner for his sake; but bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God.




In observance of the Christmas Holy Day, and the winter breaks for students in Newtown Public Schools, we will not hold classes the week of Christmas.


