

- A Message from Monsignor Bob-

Gold I bring to crown him again, King forever, ceasing never, over us all to reign.

Frankincense to offer have I:
incense owns a deity nigh:
prayer and praising gladly raising, worship him, God on high.

Myrrh is mine; its bitter perfume breathes a life of gathering gloom; sorrowing, sighing, bleeding, dying sealed in the stone cold tomb.

Star of wonder, star of night, star with royal beauty bright; westward leading, still proceeding, guide us to thy perfect light.

And so like the shepherds, they travelled following that Bethlehem star. Was it out of curiosity, or were they truly seeking the truth that the long awaited Savior had been born? They presented gifts symbolic of the role Christ was to play in the history of salvation: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Each gift had a deep significance in the life He was called to live while on this earth. Gold symbolizes His kingship and the creation of a new kingdom where justice, equality, forgiveness, love, hope, and peace were the laws by which we are called to live. Frankincense reminds us of the great mystery of the Incarnation, both God and human dwelling among us. Myrrh signifies the horrible suffering and death He would experience at the hands of those He came to save. The word "epiphany" has become very popular in our world today as individuals finally see and understand something they were not able to see or understand before. It is an eye-opening and mind-expanding moment in their life. The Epiphany we celebrate today is not only for our eyes or minds, it is for our hearts to be opened and accept Jesus Christ as the Son of God. It is a day when we remind ourselves of His power and goodness that can transform the world if we only trust and follow His ways and teachings. Let us follow that same star through our lives. Let us present the gift of ourselves to Him. Let us open our eyes to see more clearly, our minds to better understand the truths He taught us, and our hearts to the one who would die in order that we may live.

In many countries this is a day for having your home blessed. Priests travel from home to home marking the doors with the initials of the three wisemen and pray for God's blessing on the home and family for the new year. I would like to invite you to ask blessing on your home. Gather your family today and offer this prayer:

Bless, O Lord, this house and family and allow all of us who live in this home to find in it a shelter of peace and health.

Inspire each of us to develop our individual talents and to contribute wisdom and good works for the benefit of our whole family.

Make our house a haven of love for each of us and a place of warmth and caring for all those who come to visit us.

Enlighten us with the brilliance of the Epiphany star, so that, as we go into the world we might clearly see our way to You and discover Your goodness to us in all that we do every day.

Bless us with all that we need to live Your ways and consecrate this home to Your glory and presence in our lives.

Thanks once again for all your generosity and support of the parish during these holydays. We are truly blessed by your goodness and kindness. 




