



# - A Message from Monsignor Bob-

Your light must shine before others that they might see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father.

This weekend's liturgy continues the great theme of light, the message that has been shared with us since the beginning of Advent. We are reminded of the power of God's light as it shines in the darkness. And now we are asked to take that light and make a difference in the world. Isaiah invites us to share our bread with the hungry, to shelter the homeless, to clothe those who are naked and to open our eyes and our ears to all those in need, even those closest to us. This is quite a different message from the one that we have heard the past several weeks because it is a message that calls us to action. We have been given the light, and now it remains up to us to take responsibility for that gift. Like all other messages we have been given, the choice is ours. We can hide the light away within ourselves, we can use it to our own advantage or we can do as the Lord asks and bring it to the world. The Gospel passage only reinforces the prophecy of Isaiah. We can be like salt that sits in a container and after time loses its flavor or we can allow it to be used to bring flavor to the world! We can be like a light under a cover which no one can see or share it until it burns out, which eventually it will. Or we can put that light out there for others to see and recognize the hope that is ours in faith. Isaiah reminds us that it is more than simply supporting a scheduled food or clothing drive or providing a homeless shelter with a donation. It is a lifetime attitude of caring and generosity that guides our every action and decision. Paul tells us that it is not a matter of grandiosity, it is simple everyday living and caring. These readings are a good source of meditation about ourselves and our relationship with the Lord and one another, so let us be slow to dismiss them! Just how generous are we when it comes to sharing the abundance of time, talent, and treasure the Lord has given us?



#### Candlelight Mass - Feb. 26






