

BLESSING OF ASHES ON ASH WEDNESDAY

Let us pray....

O God, who desire not the death of sinners, but their conversion, mercifully hear our prayers and in your kindness bless + these ashes,

which we intend to receive upon our heads, that we, who acknowledge we are but ashes and shall return to dust, may, through a steadfast observance of Lent, gain pardon for sins and newness of life after the likeness of your Risen Son.

Who lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen.

Lent is upon us as we receive ashes this Wednesday, February 22. Now is the time to start thinking about how you will be observing this holy season of our Church. It is gift to us to be able to have these days of spiritual renewal for ourselves and one another. I know how difficult it can be to observe the resolutions we make on New Year's Day. It is difficult not in terms of making them, but keeping them; 365 days is a long time! It should be much easier for us to think of some resolutions we can keep for 40 days. I would suggest that perhaps rather than individual Lenten resolutions, we make them as a couple, a family, or with a friend. That support can help us observe them more easily. There are so many ways we can observe fast and abstinence, penance, charity, and good works. I am still a firm believer in "giving something up for Lent." Whether it is the traditional "sweets" or something more significant, it shows our willingness to go without something we enjoy to help empty ourselves so as to fill ourselves with the grace of these days. Lent is modeled on Jesus' 40 days in the desert when He fasted and prayed day and night. He used this as an opportunity to empty Himself so as to be filled with the strength of His Father's grace that enabled Him to complete His ministry and accept His eventual passion and death. He was tempted away from his efforts by the devil, but He chose to stand strong in His resolutions. By following His example, we too can use the energy and time we have from our sacrifices to reach out to others in positive and caring ways. Take a moment and reflect on the numerous ways by which you could observe this holy season. The world is in great need of those who are willing to extend themselves in charity, concern, love, forgiveness, and hope...and this is the perfect season in which to do just that. Spend the next few days deciding what you are willing to do not only to deepen your faith and align yourself more closely to Christ, but to make the difference the world so desperately needs.

ABSTINENCE is a penitential practice consisting of refraining from the consumption of meat (including poultry) and is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age or older. FASTING is to be observed by Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 years of age. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed with two smaller meals according to a person's needs and nothing between meals.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence.

The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.






