

Our parish family will always remember in our hearts and minds those persons who have gone on to the heavenly banquet. On Sunday, March 5th, at the 11:30 AM Mass, we celebrate in a special way Harry Waterbury, Franca DeAngelis, John Craven, and Deacon James Volpe whom we have served during the past month. Although we miss their physical presence among us, we rejoice that they are with the Lord. We also want their families and friends to know that we are here to support them. Please continue to pray for all our deceased, their families, and their friends.

- A Message from Monsignor Bob-

Although we are only eleven days into Lent, still very early along our Lenten pilgrimage, the readings this weekend share the theme of beginning the journey of faith even while giving us a glimpse of our final destination. The Gospel narrative of the Transfiguration marks the beginning of the end of Jesus' earthly life. After the Transfiguration, Jesus sets his face toward Jerusalem and begins the death march toward the Holy City, which will culminate in Holy Week and his Crucifixion.

In our first reading from Genesis, Abraham is called to begin his journey of faith. The promises made to Abraham as he begins his journey are significant in Abraham's commitment to the Lord.

+ God promises that he will become a "great nation." This is fulfilled at Sinai when the multitudes of Abraham's descendants are formed into a nation by receiving the Mosaic Covenant, the Ten Commandments.

+ God promises Abraham a "great name." This finds fulfillment in the Davidic Covenant in which one line of Abraham's descendants, David, is established as king over Israel.

+ God promises Abraham that through him will be "universal blessing." This promise looks forward to the New Covenant when Jesus will become the source of blessings for those who believe.

God is ever faithful in all His promises to us throughout all of history. It is Abraham who bears the title "Father of Faith" for his trust in and commitment to the promises made to him. Saint Paul encourages us to have the same faith and trust as we enter into our journey, a journey that may be filled with hardships and challenges.

The Transfiguration is a foretaste or a glimpse into the glory of Christ in His resurrected state. The sight of His glory is given to Peter, James, and John to encourage them to persevere through the difficult times that lie ahead of them as they are called to witness to the Resurrection of Christ. This is once again a revelation of Jesus as the promised Savior, whose mission will be fulfilled through His death and resurrection.

We are called in a similar way by each of these passages to strengthen the journey of faith that each of us is called to make during this holy season. Where are we since the ashes were placed on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday? Have we increased our prayer life? Have we chosen a sacrifice we are willing to make that shadows the sacrifice Christ was willing to make on our behalf? Have we become more generous with our time, with our talent, and with our treasure to help build up the Body of Christ on earth? Have we looked deep within ourselves to identify the need for reconciliation with those who we have hurt or who have hurt us? Have we observed the days of fast and abstinence? Have we realized the grace-filled opportunity that Lent provides us a believer in Christ? Are we willing to be transfigured before the world as the person we truly are? Lent is an invitation that calls for a response. It is never too late to make that response!

Next weekend will be Father Tomasz' final weekend with us at Saint Rose. There will be a reception following the 11:30 Mass next Sunday if you would like to wish him well in his new assignment at Saint John's Parish in Darien.

In light of Fr Tomasz's transfer, there will not be another full time priest assigned to the parish. This may create a need to make some adjustments in our parish schedule. I ask that you be patient and understanding during this time of transition. I am sure you know that the two of us will do the best we can during these weeks and months ahead. It is my hope that the diocese will be able to assist us in finding some priests to cover some of the Masses for us.

ANNUAL BISHOP'S APPEAL is underway. Please do your best in supporting the Annual Appeal and assist the diocese in their effort to live the mission Christ set for us as His followers. 
