- A Wessage from Monsignor Bob

COME AND SEE A MAN WHO TOLD ME EVERYTHING I HAVE DONE. COULD HE POSSIBLY BE THE CHRIST?

This question lingers not just in the mind of the woman Jesus encountered at the well in Samaria but for all those who witnessed that event in the ministry of Christ....and probably a question that lingers in the minds of all of us at one time or another. Does Jesus really know all that is in our hearts? This Gospel for the Third Week in Lent helps us appreciate the incredible empathy that Jesus has for His people, especially those weighed down by the guilt of their sinful lives. We see that perfectly demonstrated in the encounter with the woman of Samaria. Despised already by society for her ethnicity and even more so for the choices she made in her life, Jesus is not afraid to enter into a relationship and a dialogue with her. His request was a simple one, but it brought great apprehension to her. Why would He speak to me? Jesus could see she was thirsty not only physically coming to the well to draw water but also thirsting for a conversion in her personal life. It is a reminder to all of us that God's love is unconditional and free of any stereotypes or prejudice, unlike the love we often have for one another. Jesus takes us for who we are with all our wrinkles and wounds and even darkness. He helps this woman see beyond her human thirst to a water that truly quenches, one that not only satisfies her physical need but also her spiritual wellbeing. That is the promise given to each of us who are faithful to our God. The life-giving water of Jesus is not found in the water that covers our world. Even though our water is filtered, purified, or chemically made pure, it is still no match for the water that Jesus offers us. The invitation to the Samaritan woman is given to us every day in our journey with Christ...come and drink! That water gives us the hope of which Saint Paul speaks in his Letter to the Romans: "Hope does not disappoint because the love of God has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. God proves His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Why not drink of the water that gives life and sustains us in a world of so much stress and distress and anxiety? Our God will never allow us to go thirsty as long as we keep our faith and trust in Him. We are told to drink water throughout our day for our physical well-being....how much more important we drink the water of our salvation in order to have true life?

Those who choose to eat meat on St. Patrick's Day are asked to substitute the practice of abstinence of that Friday with abstinence from meat on another day of Lent that is not a Friday, or another equally penitential practice.

May your days be many and your troubles be few. May all God's blessings descend upon you. May peace be within you, may your heart be strong. May you find what you are seeking wherever you roam. May the strength of God pilot us, may the wisdom of God instruct us. May the hand of God protect us, may the word of God direct us. May Thy salvation, O Lord, be always ours this day and for evermore. Amen.


March 12 - 14 Children's Masses for Lent






