- 1 Nessage from Monsignar Bab-

The liturgy for this Fourth Sunday in Lent is a call to recognize the blindness that exists in the life of each of us. Spiritual blindness keeps us away from the light that is Christ, a light we are called to be for this world by our faithfulness and witness. Lent is the perfect opportunity for us to identify our personal blindnesses. What is keeping us from following the way set for us by Christ? We are masters of excuses why we do what we do, often justifying our own sinfulness. Pride is the greatest of all sins, and it is pride that tells us we really do nothing wrong and have no need for forgiveness. What an empty world that creates for us, even though society might easily convince us that this is a perfectly appropriate way to think of ourselves! Personal blindness keeps us from seeing the goodness God created in us, and the goodness that we are called to bring to the lives of one another. Selfishness, greed, lust, hopelessness, jealousy, hate, revenge are just a few of the obstacles that stand in the way of the peace we could have in life. Failure to forgive makes it impossible for us to love, and the longer we hold on to our hurts, the less peace we will have in our daily living. What about our blindness toward others? The lack of respect we can so often show to our spouses, our children, our parents, and those in authority is perfect evidence of our lack of concern for others. The time we need to give to raising our family, nurturing our marriage, working fairly and the need to reach out to those in need in our community can often be lost by the lack of vision we may have recognizing those needs. Blindness can easily overtake us unless we keep our eyes open to all that is true and right. Saint Paul encourages us to put aside the darkness and walk in the light of the Lord: "Live as children of the light, for light produces every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth...take no part in the fruitless works of darkness." Recently I had cataract surgery. Prior to the surgery, every person I encountered told me to look forward to the world I would see and how vibrant the colors will be. Sure enough, as I left the hospital, I opened my eyes to see colors that were once dull now bright. It is an easy process to remove cataracts, but a much more difficult one to remove the cataracts of our souls that blind us and dull our vision!

HAPPY SAINT JOSEPH DAY!

The Feast of Saint Joseph is celebrated on March 19, but because this date is a Sunday this year, his feast will be celebrated on Monday. While little is known from the Scriptures about this great saint, he looms large in the history of the Church and our salvation. When you think what was asked of him in the times in which he lived, there can be nothing but respect and admiration for him. Accepting Mary to be his wife after she conceived Jesus by the Holy Spirit was in itself a hallmark of his faith and belief in God. The weary journey to Bethlehem, witnessing his son born in a stable because they could not find any other shelter, escaping to Egypt to protect his child from Herod and returning to his humble home in Nazareth where he would provide for his family as a carpenter and raise his son...that was the task set before him by God. Joseph remains a strong reflection of the power of God working through humanity. May we seek his intercession and guidance as we continue on our journey of faith and have his deep trust in God's will for each of us.






