- A Nessage from Monsignor Bob

#### LET THE ALLELUIAS CONTINUE.....

We gather on this Third Sunday of the Easter Season to continue our celebration of the resurrection of Jesus and renew our hope that one day we will share in that great gift won for us by His suffering and death. What sets Jesus apart from the numerous religious leaders or founders of religions that have appeared on the stage of world history over the centuries? One way that he is different is that, unlike Buddha or Mohammed, Jesus rose from the grave after his death, appearing and talking to his followers. The readings for this third week remind us that Jesus' suffering and Resurrection were foreshadowed by the sacred writings of the prophets of Israel, hundreds of years before He walked among us. In our first reading, we witness Peter referring to the Psalms of King David trying to convince the Jews that Jesus is the promised Messiah: "He foresaw and spoke of the resurrection of the Christ, that neither was he abandoned to the netherworld nor did his flesh see corruption. God raised this Jesus; of this we are all witnesses." The question Peter set before them was whether they believed or not; how much more proof do you need? The Gospel brings concrete evidence to that psalm. Here is Jesus walking the road to Emmaus when He encounters two of His disciples who were discussing among themselves the events of the day. As Jesus approached them, they did not recognize Him. Jesus inquires what they are speaking about, acting very naively to the reality of the situation: "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?" Jesus responds innocently: "What sort of things?" They said: "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him." They went on to recount the events surrounding His resurrection and how some of the women went to the tomb and found it empty as did they when they went to see for themselves. Jesus realizes that they did not recognize Him and remarks: "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke!" And as He continued conversation with them, they came to realize that He was the fulfillment of the Old Testament, that He was the Messiah and that they were walking with their salvation right next to them. They came to know him in the breaking of the bread that He shared with them and were able to testify to all they met: "The Lord has truly been raised!" We are not unlike these disciples on the road. Sometimes it takes us time to free ourselves of all that distracts us to recognize those things that truly matter in life.....Jesus walks with us every step we take and yet too often we do not realize His presence. Easter is a wonderful invitation to recognize the incredible love that God holds for His people and His constant presence in our lives. I wonder if we were as privileged as these two disciples to encounter Jesus as intimately as they did, would we really know what is happening and who is speaking to us? Let the Alleluias continue in our lives, for Christ is risen!

Why do we offer retreats? Using the model of Jesus Himself who took time away to be alone in order to pray and deepen His relationship with the Father and open Himself to the grace and power of the Holy Spirit, we need to free ourselves once in a while to do exactly the same. Our lives are so cluttered these days with so much busy-ness that we rarely take time to simply reflect on our relationship with the Lord and ask ourselves why we really do believe. A retreat is the perfect opportunity to do as Jesus did. We are often too hesitant to take the time we need for the things that really matter in life. For years, you have heard our parishioners speak to you from the pulpit about our men's and women's retreats. Every one of them speaks to the same matter in life. What are we doing to deepen our faith and enhance our relationship with those in our lives? The men in particular tell how this time away helped them appreciate the relationships in their lives and the need to deepen them with patience, love and faith. Why are we so afraid to take some time for ourselves and recognize issues in our lives that are taking us away from what really matters? Please pray for our men who are on retreat this weekend and the women who will join us next weekend. And if you never have taken a retreat, there is always next year!

#### May 13 First Communion Ceremonies


