

A MESSAGE FROM Father Peter -

Holy Trinity, Holy Joy

To a child, pulling up to a playground, one would think you had just pulled up to the gates of Disney World. No sooner is that door open than he or she is rushing to that first swing or that first monkey bar...initially frozen in place, already breathing hard and heavy with excitement: where shall he or she go first?

For a child, a play ground seems more his natural state than even being home, as though play was what specifically a child was made for. But just as wonderful is the attitude of the parent who is witness to this play, who makes this time of fun and joy possible.

Parents really live to accomplish one primary goal in the lives of their children and that is to help make them happy. I cannot imagine a more satisfying moment for a parent than when they see their child deliriously happy, and so simply as when they are taken to a playground.

And not only does a parent's heart swell with a similar joy, but their mind will as well with memories of days long ago when, as children, they too romped and stomped and enjoyed simpler times when children themselves.

But perhaps best of all for a parent is not so much being a spectator to their child's joy but actually participating in it themselves.

What little boy does not cherish those moments when, happening upon dad doing some work, he too wants to help out. Dad beneath the car changing the oil and as a little boy thinking, "Wow, dad is taking a mystery adventure to the center of the earth"...that is, until he asks you to hand him a wrench and invites you to slide on under beside him.

And there you stand, a little nervous, but extremely excited to actually share in dad's great car adventure...another Disney experience of sorts. A classic father/child moment being beside dad as his master craftsman helping to repair what is broken or put together what is new. As God the Father and His Son Jesus Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit do in repairing us and our world through the process of Redemption.

Jesus is the son of God...His child, so to speak. God is love and the greatest attribute of love is the joy it brings to the one who is in love. And for the lover, as with a parent, there is no greater sense of warmth and joy than when one's beloved, whether a child, one's spouse, or best friend, is happy.

We live to make one another happy, or should, because the very nature of the Holy Trinity is just that: to love so as to insure the infinite joy of the one being loved.

And there is no holiday that captures this love and joy partnership more beautifully and with more excitement than Christmas. More than any gift a parent can receive, to hear that "deafening" pitter patter of feet tearing down those stairs into the living room and diving like Olympic Champs into that ocean of wrapped gifts is total joy pure and simple.

To see that look of awe, wonder, and gratitude on a child's face as they hold in their hands or against their wildly beating hearts their favorite toys. And there you are, mom and dad holding hands, holding hearts, never more happy, never more proud to be parents. Recapturing that freshness of childhood yourselves, feeling that all is right in the world, at least, this particular world under this particular roof.

And to feel all this, though only in a super tiny way, is to feel as God does about us, who are His children. How God the Father felt when, like Christmas, His own beloved Son empowered by the wonderfully creative imagination of the Holy Spirit unwrapped the gift of creation, setting all things in motion that all things, most of all us, might exist.

For when it came time to create man, we hear: "I found delight in the human race." So much so did God find delight in the human race that he wanted to become human himself, to become the gift that He so much wanted to give to us. "The Lord possessed me, the beginning of his ways...the forerunner of his prodigies of long ago...from of old I was poured forth."

And what God poured forth by way of beauty, creativity, power, majesty and joy into the creation of the entire universe is the same power of love and energy that He poured forth into His greatest delight: you and me. This is why Christmas remains always so precious a celebration for all of us.

For as once God poured forth the power of his being into the darkness of the universe's womb and life sprung forth with a big exciting bang...so the Holy Spirit poured forth into the womb of Mary as a master craftsman of life and together they conceived our infant God, Jesus Christ.

Mary is the Fullness of Grace; the magnificence of God's infinite love is poured forth into a singular vessel of all-encompassing beauty and joy we know to be the Blessed Virgin Mary.

And God the Father and Mary our Mother are never more happy, more satisfied than when giving to us the gift of Jesus Christ and when with joy we receive that gift with open arms, open hearts...nowhere more beautifully that when receiving Holy Communion, the ultimate Trinitarian gift of peace and joy.




