

# A MESSAGE FROM Father Peter

I am sure we have all had the experience of the joy of the announcement that someone we love is pregnant. In today's first reading the prosperity of Jerusalem is linked with Motherhood. "I will spread prosperity over Jerusalem like a river. As nurslings, you shall be carried in her arms, and fondled in her lap; as a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you..."

This should not be some mysterious reference for us as Catholics since we refer to the Church as Holy Mother Church. We are her children since we were drawn forth from her womb from those baptismal waters; we can only claim God as our Father because the Church is our Mother.

However, when Adam and Eve committed the original sin, curses were imposed, and one of those curses: "To the woman God said: I will intensify your labor in childbearing; in pain- you shall bring forth children."

Are we then to associate pregnancy with a curse? Not in reference to Jesus Christ whose primary mission was to reverse the curse of sin, and instead draw forth from it the absolute greatest good...everlasting life and love.

Of all the images He could have used to describe to His Apostles the significance of His Passion He explains, "When a woman is in labor, she is in anguish because her hour has arrived; but when she has given birth to a child, she no longer remembers the pain because of her joy that a child has been born into the world. So you also are now in anguish. But I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy away from you."

This week I happened to see what is one of the more inspiring music videos...a video that captures the essence of today's first reading and the Motherhood of Mary, the Church, and all Moms.

Nick Cannon is one of the more popular and iconic entertainers in the world. However, that could not have happened unless he was born...a story he shares in the real-life story of his music video entitled *Can I Live?* 

The video opens with a young woman being dropped off at an Abortion Clinic who must make her way through a protesting crowd of Pro-lifers pleading with her to change her mind.

As the video continues, a grown up Nick Cannon playing the voice of himself from the womb sings the story of the experience, which turns out is the actual experience of his own Mom in 1979. He is typically positioned behind his mother, singing into her ear in hopes of changing her mind, singing as her child from the womb, for example, as she signs in at the check-in counter. Then you hear the background chorus singing the refrain, a choir of children in fact, "Can I live?"

The climax of the video: lying on the gurney, she feels a rush of life, in the video demonstrated by a glow emanating from her womb. And jumping up from the table runs out of the clinic where standing outside is that Chorus of Children all wearing tee shirts that say "Can I live?"

The video concludes with he and his real life Mom in each other's arms with Nick singing "thanks for listening..."

Here are the lyrics but if you have the chance please watch the video:

I'm talking, ma
I know this situation is personal
But it's something that has to be told
Just, just wait, just pause for a second
Let me plead my case
You seventeen, huh
And having me, that will ruin everything huh
It's a lot of angels waiting on their wings
You see me in your sleep so you can't kill your dreams
Three hundred dollars, that's the price of living? What?
Mommy, I don't like this clinic
Hopefully you'll make the right decision
And don't go through with the knife decision
But it's hard to make the right move when you in high school
Now you gotta work all day and take night school
Hopping on the bus and the rain is pouring
What you want morning sickness or the sickness of mourning?
Can I live?

I'll always be a part of you Trust your soul, know it's always true If I could talk I'd say to you Can I live? I'm a child of the king, ain't no need to go fear me And I see the flowing tears so I know that you hear me When I move in your womb that's me being scared Cuz who knows where my future holds

Your friends look at you funny but look at you mommy That's a life inside, take a look at your turnmy What is becoming, ma? I'm Oprah bound You can tell he a star from the Ultrasound Our spirits connected, doors open now Nothing but love and respect Thanks for holding it down, she let me live

It's uplifing for real, y'all I ain't passing no judgement, I'm just telling y'all my story I love life And I love my mother for giving me life We all need to appreciate life And a strong woman who had to make a sacrifice Thanks for listening Momma, thanks for listening

Jesus once said that I have come that you may have life and have it more abundantly. There is no more abundant life then what our Holy Mother the Church provides...from those baptismal waters...from that Confessional...we are delivered from sin and death, and we nurse with everlasting delight upon the nourishment from the food the Church provides, the Bread of Life, as Jesus insists:

"For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me."




