Saint Mary Magdalene and Healing

If God is perfect love, then one of the great attributes of love is the ability to experience pity when one's beloved is in crisis. However, we need to distinguish between kinds of pity.

A friend of ours half the world away has lost someone dear to her. We pick up the phone, offer our prayers and condolences. Same situation, we pick up the phone, call the travel agent, and within hours we are by the side of our grieving loved one. Both expressions of love, but no doubt the fullest experience of that love is to have the beloved in person.

We have all had the experience of suffering. And yes, the most honest response to these situations is to ask, "Why, Lord, are you allowing this to happen?" Perhaps no prayer as the one cried from a broken heart is meant to move the Divine Heart more than this kind of cry.

And the Divine heart is indeed moved with perfect pity, because it is also a human heart. This is the great miracle and comfort of the Incarnation. In Christ, we have a God who suffers...not simply His individual pain, but the anguish of every person ever to live. He experiences the totality of suffering, so that we can one forever day experience the totality of peace and joy.

And yet, this response may do little to alleviate one's pain. One may retort: "But that was two thousand years ago! I am suffering now... Christ is not! He is in His glorious Heaven while I am stumbling through this terrible hell." Yes, the Crucifixion was an event in time but the Cross of Christ transcends time because the man on that Cross is also God...who is transcendence itself. We must believe that the Church is the Body of Christ. When any member of this Church suffers, Christ suffers because it is His body.

When one experiences the pain of a heart attack, the suffering is not localized to the heart; it affects one's whole body, weakening it and placing other areas at risk of shutting down. The mind is affected, dizzied with thoughts of fear and anxiety while the soul cries to Heaven for help.

Therefore, in any time, in any person, in any suffering, Christ is present.

The same redemptive love and mercy that was unleashed at Calvary is released right here in Newtown, CT. The same Christ, the same infinite God nailed to the Cross, is present upon our altar in the Eucharist...waiting for us, too, in Adoration, begging us to allow Him to love us, heal us, unite our pain and suffering with His own for the salvation of the world.

However, to appreciate and receive the totality of that love and healing, we must encounter Christ in the depths of our sinfulness...for it is here that the power of the Divine Pity releases its greatest healing graces. Tuesday we celebrate the Feast of Saint Mary Magdalene. She is introduced as the woman who, having been exorcised of seven demons, then followed Christ. These seven demons may refer to the seven deadly sins, indicating the terrible depth of her sinfulness.

Yet in perhaps one of the most touching scenes in all of human history, some believe that she is also the great penitent who burst through the door of Simon the Pharisee where Jesus was dining. The Gospel of Luke records: "Do you see this woman? When I entered your house, you did not give me water for my feet, but she has bathed them with her tears and wiped them with her hair. You did not give me a kiss, but she has not ceased kissing my feet since the time I entered. You did not anoint my head with oil, but she anointed my feet with ointment. So I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven; hence, she has shown great love.' He said to her, 'Your sins are forgiven.'"

Saint Mary Magdalene is perhaps the best guide for one's journey of Faith, a journey that for her begins at the Feet of Jesus, or what we would call the Confessional. Where did Mary receive the courage to not only be a disciple of Christ, but have the incredible fortitude to follow Him along the way of the Cross, and then kneel at His crucified feet? Or the love she must have had to be the first at the tomb that Easter Morning, being the first witness of the Resurrection and therefore the appointed witness to the Apostles? Mary was able to receive such an incredible fullness of Christ because of her confessed sins.

Think for a moment of those times when you were really sick. Your body wearied by illness, your mind distracted and unfocused because of the pain. A loved one is present, but in your condition it is difficult to enjoy fully his being there. Then think for a moment, restored completely to health, your body fit and strong, your mind and heart clear and at peace and that same loved one present.

In health, there is a fuller experience of one's beloved, though it is the same beloved in both situations; what has changed is your condition. Saint Mary Magdalene teaches us about the fullness of power that is Sacramental Confession. Having been freed from our sins, having that most intimate encounter with Christ at His feet in the Confessional, our experience of Christ, our receiving Him during Mass is more potent...not simply for our personal growth in holiness, but those graces will radiate forth and touch the hearts of those in our lives.




