A MESSAGE FROM Father Peter

This weekend's piece is written in the spirit of gratitude for all the Jesuits who with great devotion and dedication serve the cause of Christ especially in the area of Catholic Education. Honoring those as well who have been the beneficiaries of the great spiritual and intellectual influence so many Jesuits provide throughout the world especially here at Fairfield University and Fairfield Prep. As we hear from the Gospel, "When Jesus Christ disembarked and saw the vast crowds His heart was moved with pity for them for they were like sheep without a shepherd." And what is it that Jesus then does in response to His heart-felt compassion? "He taught them many things." Teaching was a primary concern of Jesus Christ. And it is in this same wonderful, compassionate, and impassioned Teaching Spirit of Christ that the Jesuits serve our youth and the peoples of the world.

SAINT IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA

JULY 31ST

On his way to achieving great military fame and recognition as a soldier, Ignatius' path to worldly glory came to a screeching halt when a cannon ball shattered his leg and incapacitated him for a long period of time. During this time, he became extremely depressed and could only pass the time by reading the only available books on hand: the life of Christ and the lives of the Saints.

He was deeply impressed and effected by what he read and experienced a hospital bed conversion. Having seen a vision of Mary the Mother of God, to show his devotion and appreciation for this special blessing he made a pilgrimage to her shrine in Monserrat, Spain. It was here that before the beautiful statue of the Black Madonna, he placed his sword as a symbolic gesture that he would now devote his life to being a soldier under the protection of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the spiritual military service of Jesus Christ and the Catholic Church.

In 1534, after extensive religious studies in various European universities, at the age of 43, he and six others vowed to live in poverty and chastity and to go to the Holy Land. If this became impossible, they vowed to offer themselves to the apostolic service of the pope. The latter became the only choice. Four years later Ignatius made the association permanent. The new Society of Jesus was approved by Paul III, and Ignatius was elected to serve as the first general.

Ignatius remained in Rome, consolidating the new venture, but still finding time to found homes for orphans, catechumens, and penitents. Ignatius adopted the motto "Ad Majorem De Gloriam" which translated means "All for the glory of God." This echoes the encouragement of Saint Paul from Scripture for those trying to lead and live a life dedicated to God and others, "Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another...And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."

Saint Ignatius reminds us of the importance and accessing the gifts of the Holy Spirit that we received during our Confirmation. Traditionally Confirmation was referred to as the Sacrament where one became a soldier for Jesus Christ in the army of the Church. In fact the Church here on earth is referred to as the Church Militant as we go forward with the grace of God to combat the evils and sufferings in the world, reclaiming it and others for and in the name of Jesus Christ.

And Saint Ignatius also reminds us of the necessity of having a devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. What soldier did not carry in his uniform pocket closet to his heart a picture of the woman or women he loved, either his mother, wife, fiancée, or girlfriend as an incentive to fight heroically and a greater incentive to get home safe? Devotion to Mary inspires us when the fight for sanctity in this life becomes too overwhelming to persevere in our efforts and all the more seek out the empowering gift of God's mercy.

Having developed the Spiritual Exercises during a period of great spiritual angst and depression, this gold mine of developing an effective prayer life is a further reminder that in this life there is no greater weapons that we have in our arsenal of faith than prayer and the sacraments. What soldier would dare enter a battlefield without his weapons to help defend and protect those he loves; what Christian therefore would refuse his duty of prayer and penance. So let us bravely go forth in the fight that lies ahead and all around us in this war of salvation, doing so in all things for the Greater Glory of God and one another:

"Receive, Lord, all my liberty, my memory, my understanding and my whole will. You have given me all that I have, all that I am, and I surrender all to your divine will, that you dispose of me. Give me only your love and your grace. With this I am rich enough, and I have no more to ask."




