

A MESSAGE FROM Father Peter

IN HOC SIGNO VINCES

The Power of the Cross

This weekend we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross of Christ (Sept. 14th). Throughout its first three centuries, the Church went through unimaginable persecution from the Roman Empire, though all the time growing and spreading. So imagine what an extraordinary turn of events it was when the Roman Emperor himself became a Christian. Within one person's lifetime, the Empire went from the most savage of its several persecutions of Christians to embracing Christianity.

Maxentius, who was in control of Rome, exercised diabolical/magical power that many believed was occult in origin. Constantine was convinced that he needed more powerful aid than his military forces could give him, so he sought the help of God. Keep in mind, that at this time Constantine was not a Christian. However, often seeing and hearing of the great and courageous faith of so many Christians, especially Martyrs, Constantine would be inspired to access the great gift of Faith in and from Christ, and seek the God Made Man for help in overthrowing the tyrant Maxentius.

It occurred to him that, of the many emperors who had preceded him, those who had put their hope in a multitude of gods and served them with sacrifices and offerings had been deceived by flattering predictions and oracles promising prosperity and come to a bad end. On the other hand, the one who alone had condemned their error, honoring the one Supreme God throughout his whole life [i.e. his father], had found him to be the Savior and Protector of his empire. Reflecting on this, he decided it would be foolish to join in the idle worship of those who were no gods and to err from the truth after such convincing evidence. For this reason he felt bound to honor his father's God alone.

And while he was thus praying with fervor, a most extraordinary sign appeared to him from heaven – something which it might have been hard to believe had the story been told by any other person. He said that about noon, when the day was already beginning to decline, he saw with his own eyes the sign of a cross of light in the heavens, above the sun, and bearing the inscription, IN HOC SIGNO VINCES "By this symbol you will conquer." He was struck with amazement by the sight, and his whole army witnessed the miracle.

He said that he was unsure what this apparition could mean, but that while he continued to ponder, night suddenly came on. In his sleep, Jesus Christ appeared to him with the same sign which he had seen in the heavens, and commanded him to make a likeness of that sign which he had seen, and to use it as a safeguard in all engagements with his enemies.

At the break of day, he rose and told his friends about the marvel. Then he called together the workers in gold and precious stones, sat in the midst of them, and described to them the sign he had seen.

It was made in the following manner:

A long spear overlaid with gold with a transverse bar laid over it formed the figure of the cross. A wreath of gold and precious stones was fixed to the top with the symbol of the Savior's name within it – the first two [Greek] letters of Christ's name, the rho being intersected by chi in its center. [These two letters look like X and P.] This banner was square, and the upright staff, whose lower section was of great length, bore a golden half-length portrait of the pious emperor and his children on its upper part, beneath the trophy of the cross, and immediately above the embroidered banner. The emperor constantly made use of this sign of salvation as a safeguard against every adverse and hostile power, and commanded that others similar to it should be carried at the head of all his armies.

On October 28th 312 Constantine took the Field of Battle at the Milvian Bridge in Rome and not only won the day under the Standard of the Cross but assuming the authority as the New Emperor of the Roman Empire declared Christianity no longer illegal and an offense punishable by torture and death. Under Constantine's leadership and the influence of his Queen Mother Saint Helena, Christians were free to practice their faith in Christ and spread it through-out the entire Roman Empire.

We conclude our Liturgical Year with the celebration of Christ the King. Christ rules from a throne made of wood, but not in the shape of a chair, rather of a Cross. How often in making the sign of the Cross are we aware of the power we are accessing? There is no greater weapon we can wield in this life to fight off the forces of evil and win the day for Christ than the Cross. As often as we can, let us make the sign of the Cross over ourselves and others wherever we happen to go. When we cross ourselves and others or things (especially with the generous use of Holy Water), we place the power of Christ's victorious love upon ourselves, those people, those things. Let us with confidence wear a Cross around our necks, touching it and invoking its power often during the day as it hangs closest to our heart, its innumerable graces flowing from that Cross into our hearts and through us into the whole world.




