A MESSAGE FROM Father Peter

GUARDIAN HUMANS

"Why do you let me see ruin; why must I look at misery?"

This month of October is Respect Life Month and recently, I came across the following sign: "Abortion is a human right."

Where exactly do we get our rights from if not entrusted to us from a power much greater than us, so that, rather than speaking in terms of human rights, what about Divine Rights?

And since the Divine called all things and us into being, does it not stand to reason God should call the shots, as He did on Mount Sinai, entrusting to Moses, the people, and all of us those rights we refer to as the Ten Commandments, one of which is "Thou shall not kill"?

Ask yourself this question: who prefers violence, misery, destruction, killing and death? Who promotes it, God or the Devil? Who refers to Himself as the way, the truth, and the life? Jesus or Satan, who is the Father of Lies; Abba Father or the Devil?

Recently, we celebrated the Feast Day of the Guardian Angels. The word "Guard" means to protect from harm and danger.

So ask yourself, are you more grateful for God assigning you a guardian angel or do you prefer He assign each of us a fallen one who desires to harm us at every turn?

Because the fact of the matter is, if you were to place just one of us in a room filled with all the Heavenly Angels, that one person, that one human, would be the most beautiful and all those angels would be in awe of you. And why? From the Book of Hebrews:

"In these last days, God spoke to us through a son, whom he made heir of all things and through whom he created the universe, who is the radiance of his glory, the very imprint of his being. For to which of the angels did God ever say: 'You are my son; this day I have begotten you'? Or again: 'I will be a father to him, and he shall be a son to me'? And again, when he leads the first-born into the world, he says: 'Let all the angels of God worship him.'"

This is a reference to the Incarnation; God has become Man so that we can become like God, this same God who announces to us, "You are my son, you are my daughter." Therefore, we must recognize then as all the Angels do in every human being this awesome Godness.

There is nothing more sacred than human life because we are created with everlasting life with God in mind.

There is a moving story of a young girl who, watching the evening news, became very disturbed by all the pain, violence, depression and suffering in the world, like the upset prophet Habakkuk today.

Retiring to bed, she got down on her knees to say her prayers and pleaded with God: "God, why don't you do something about all this pain, violence, loneliness, and misery." And receiving no response she fell asleep, her pillow soaked with tears.

And prior to that alarm clock going off, she was awoken to a voice she heard loud and clear in her heart...it was God saying: "I did do something about it...I created you."

Have you ever thought that the reason why you exist is in answer to a prayer similar to the lament made by both the prophet and this bothered young girl?

What would you have others say about you: are you an answer to many prayers, or do you represent that awful silence where it seems all that is accomplished is more pain, more misery, and untold violence and death, refusing that role similar to a Guardian Angel and instead opting for what is more akin to a "let your guard down fallen angel" who promotes complaining, misery and pain?

At the beginning of Creation, God gave man dominion over all the earth, all living creatures...why? So that we can participate in the power of God, and the nature of that power is love, to care for and about another. Exploiting God's creation, depleting its resources is not what God had in mind... dominion is not tyranny nor is it deciding who gets to live and die.

The dominion that God has in mind, Jesus Himself modeled on the night of the Last Supper when, getting on hands and knees, wiped the dirty feet of his Apostles, echoing His earlier sentiments, "the Son of Man has come not to be served but to serve and give His life as a ransom for many." Notice He doesn't say, "Take life as a ransom for many," but "Sacrifice His own life so innocent life will never again have to be taken."

As Saint Paul says today, "Guard this rich trust with the help of the Holy Spirit that dwells within us."

There is no greater treasure or riches entrusted to us to guard than life, except everlasting life purchased at the life, dying, and death of Jesus Christ.

How fortunate...how guarded our lives have been till this moment...how blessed we are to gather here, having been alive for so many years since that moment when we were held and cradled to be presented for baptism. Why then insist that another be deprived of that protection that, being guarded, we too often take for granted?

From the Gospel, "The disciples had been arguing among themselves on the way who was the greatest. Taking a child Jesus placed it in their midst, and putting his arms around it he said to them, "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."

So let us pray Lord that you will increase our faith and increase our love and respect for all life which you have entrusted to us as your Guardian Saints.






OCIA - the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults begins October 16, 2025. We encourage any adult who has questions about Catholicism to join us.


