

A MESSAGE FROM Father Peter

Veteran's Day Reflection

Vincent Capodanno was born February 13, 1929, youngest of ten children of an Italian immigrant couple. He grew up on Staten Island, joined the Maryknoll order to become a missionary, and was ordained in 1958. September 4, 1967 found him, a Navy chaplain in Vietnam, with the 1st Battalion 5th Marines near the village of Dong Son in the Que-Son Valley. A Navy medic, Lt. Joseph E. Pilon, described the day's events.

"On Labor Day our battalion ran into a world of trouble... 500 Marines against 2500 North Vietnamese Army regulars. We were constantly on the verge of [being] completely overrun and the Marines on several occasions had to 'advance in a retrograde movement.' This left the dead and wounded outside the perimeter....

"Casualties were running high and Fr. C. had his work cut out for him. Early in the day, he was shot through the right hand which all but shattered his hand — one corpsman patched him up and tried to med evac him but Fr. C. declined. A few hours later a mortar landed near him and left his right arm in shreds hanging from his side. Once again he was patched up and once again he refused evacuation.

"There he was, moving slowly from wounded to dead to wounded using his left arm to support his right as he gave absolution or last rites, when suddenly he spied a corpsman get knocked down by the burst of an automatic weapon. Fr. C. ran out to him and positioned himself between the injured boy and the automatic weapon. Suddenly the weapon opened up again and this time riddled Fr. C. from the back of his head to the base of his spine—and with his third Purple Heart of the day Fr. C. went Home."

In the Gospel we hear Jesus: "Blessed are those servants whom the Master finds vigilant on His arrival." The vigilance of the Christian is similar to the vigilance of the soldier on the battlefield. He may not have to dodge bullets or mortar fire, but this does not make the lives and souls of those entrusted to his care any less difficult or this life and culture we live in any less of a battlefield. And this vigilance is not simply a waiting around, drumming one's finger tips upon the table. It is the active vigilance of the Christian who, with devotion to Christ and Church, stands between the dangers of this life and its countless seductive evils and the people God loves to infinity entrusted to him.

And he does so armed to the teeth with constant prayer, numerous devotions like the Rosary which become for others their shields of protection. And the greatest weapons of all drawn forth from His nuclear arsenal of graces and blessings: the sacraments. In place of the violence, madness, and horror of war the Christian confronts the terrors of fear, sin, suffering and death that seem to launch wave after wave of attack against the human heart, overburdening it with sorrow, and in place of this pain, with his vigilance he provides comfort, strength, and healing for the wounded emotional and spiritual soldiers we all become in this challenging world.

As Christ placed Himself in the line of fire of sin and death, and as Fr Capodanno did, both not only with their heart, mind, and soul but fulfilling the demands of their sacrifice by giving up their bodies as well; for love and devotion put no limits on what they shall give...wanting to give everything.

One of the most intense passages regarding the nature of the Priesthood and by extension the nature of any Christian life is the following written by Pope John Paul II regarding the Mass: "Be aware of what you are doing; imitate what you hold in your hands. Just as the whole life of Our Savior was pointed toward His sacrifice of Himself, so too the life of the priest, who must reproduce the image of Christ in himself, must become a pleasing sacrifice with Him and through Him and in Him. . . And so it is not enough for him to celebrate the Eucharistic sacrifice, but in a very deep sense, he must live it; for in this way, he can draw from it the heavenly strength that will enable him to be profoundly transformed and to share in the sacrificial life of the Divine Redeemer himself. The soul of the priest must refer what takes place on the sacrificial altar to himself; for just as Jesus Christ sacrifices Himself, his minister must sacrifice himself along with Him... to bring about his own purification and that of his neighbors."

As the body draws strength, life, and health from each breath it takes and beat of its heart, we must draw our strength from the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. In the offering of Christ to the Father, their blessing of it will then fall upon ourselves so that they may then offer us, sanctified, as so many gifts of graces to bring healing, hope, and more love to others who are being overrun by the forces of evil in this world.

Jesus reminds us that HE has come not to be served but to serve and give His life as a ransom for many. To wait on one...to serve another and what more and what better can one give than one's entire life in love for another? Again, the words of Christ on the night of the Last Supper, Fr Capodanno on the day of his last moments on earth: "Greater love hath no man than to lay down his life for those he loves." Thank you Veterans and all in our armed forces who do that laying down and loving each day.




