

### A MESSAGE FROM Father Peter

King-Sized Faith

For many, it was one of those historical "Where were you when you heard?" moments; The day was November 22, 1963 and then President John F. Kennedy was assassinated. What many more people do not realize is that, on that same day, two other prominent people passed away: giants not only in the field of Literature but theology, sociology, and politics as well: C.S. Lewis and Aldous Huxley.

Some years back, a Philosophy and Theology Professor at Boston University, Peter Kreeft, penned an amazing book called *Between Heaven and Hell*. The book is written in dialogue form and takes place between JFK, C.S. Lewis, and Huxley after they have awoken on the other side and realize how very real the after-life is.

However, before moving forward into the Heavenly realm, they have a bit of a purgatorial debate in which they need to solidify what they really think about Christ and Christianity. The major premise of the three speakers is to discover who the real Jesus is and why that should have any relevance in one's life.

Lewis begins the conversation with a challenge to Kennedy: Who is Jesus according to your faith? To which Kennedy responds: the ideal man, the man so perfect and wise that his followers called him divine. Not God become man but man become God. Lewis then sets out to demonstrate to Kennedy and Huxley that Jesus is truly the Son of God and therefore God:

Consider this: Christ claimed to be the "Son of God."

Lewis: What is the primary thing a father gives to his son?

Kennedy: Love, I suppose.

Lewis: Try again.

Kennedy: Education? Caring? Time?

Lewis: All those can be given only if the primary gift is given first.

Kennedy: You mean existence.

Lewis: Yes. And what kind of existence? Kennedy: Human existence, of course.

Lewis: Yes. Human existence, human life, human nature. Human parents give humanity to their children. And what do oyster parents give

to their oyster children? Kennedy: Oyster nature.

Lewis: And the son of a wolf is...

Kennedy: A wolf. And the son of a Martian is a Martian.

Lewis: And the Son of God?

Lewis then continues: Now suppose I claimed to be God—the God who created you and this whole universe, the cosmic Mind that has always existed. Suppose I claimed to be your Savior, to forgive your sins, save your soul from hell and take you to heaven if only you believed in me and worshiped me. Suppose I said I was utterly sinless, and that I would rise from the dead, and because I would rise, you would rise too. What would you think of me then?

Kennedy: That you were quite insane, if you really believed it.

Lewis: So it follows that the greatest insanity would be claiming to be God.

Huxley then chimes in. He takes a more general approach of things...that there is a force that created the universe that remains impersonal and uninvolved with its creation...leaving one to feel as though one is an orphan. To which Lewis responds:

First of all, a literary critic should ask of a story first of all what the whole story is about, and interpret particular events in the context of the whole story. And the story in the Bible is about God's search for man ...

Huxley: You mean man's search for God.

Lewis: No. From the biblical point of view, speaking about man's search for God is like speaking about the mouse's search for the cat. The point is that the God of the Bible invades man's world of time rather than man mystically invading God's eternity.

Man searches for God in God's home, eternity, but God searches for man in man's home, time. And that's the God of the Bible, the Father looking for his prodigal son, the shepherd for his lost sheep. God takes the initiative. God always takes the initiative, from the act of creation on. The supreme example is the Incarnation.

The primary truth then that Christ came to testify to and give His life for is that God is Father...He is OUR Father. Kings are identified by what they wear, referred to as their robe of majesty. And the Robe that Christ wrapped Himself in is our humanity...it is the Incarnation."

How then can we dare enter into the season where God is carried as an infant in the womb of Mary to be born in total poverty and humility in a cave, who comes to bring peace to people of good will, when we instead choose hyper-commercialism and that dogged refusal to be more active and committed and daily disciples of Jesus Christ? "Whatever you do the least of My brothers and sisters, you did to Me."

The King in tattered robes remains condemned and bleeding from the scourging of violence that especially in the Middle East is inflicted upon His body in the many who suffer.

If we truly believe God is our Father, then, contrary to Cain's hellish self-absorption and selfishness, we are truly ALL one another's brother's and sister's keeper. It is not enough to just believe in God—the devil and all the demons believe in Him as well—but what do we believe about God?

As Christ the King extends His arms upon the throne of the Cross, so must we extend our arms to embrace the sufferings, agonies, and cries for healing and peace of the world, beginning with our brothers and sisters we meet and encounter each day.

### Special Mass for Religious Ed students - Dec 8


